- **Climate Change Patch**

This patch will inform, advance skills, and create leaders in a generation of girls that will be most impacted by the effects of climate change





- **Forever Green 2013 Patch**  
This patch program encourages girls to Take Action to improve the environment and protect natural resources

- **Forever Green – Understanding Water Conservation Patch**

This patch program has been designed to educate girls about water conservation, exploring water footprints, and how to save money reducing water usage





- **Girl Scouts Go Green Patch**

One of the provisions of the Girl Scout Law is that Girl Scouts use resources wisely. What exactly does that mean?

- **Project Pollinate**

The goal of the Project Pollinate Patch program is to educate girls about the importance of preserving pollinators
