

# **Girl Scout Silver Award FAQs**

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### Q: What grade or level earns the Silver Award?

**A:** Cadette Girl Scouts currently in grades 6th through 8th or equivalent, are eligible to earn the Silver Award.

#### Q: What are the prerequisites for earning the Silver Award?

A: All Cadette Girl Scouts are required to complete one Cadette Girl Scout level journey, including

the journey's Take Action project. All prerequisites must be complete prior to beginning work

on the project.

## Q: How many girls can work together on a group Silver Award Project?

A: No more than four girls (max) may work together on a group project.

#### Q: How many hours are required to earn the Silver Award?

**A:** Cadette Girl Scouts should spend 50 hours of time planning and implementing their project. Each team member must individually contribute 50 hours, whether working solo or as part of a team. Note: This time does not include time spent on prerequisites.

#### Q: What are the standards for a Silver Award project?

**A:** The project is done <u>with</u> the community and <u>not for</u> the community. It should address the root cause of an issue and girls should be able to clearly articulate what their community issue is and how the project impacts that issue. The project should also be measurable, sustainable, and involve community partners.

#### Q: Does council need to approve our project idea before beginning the award?

**A:** Yes, GSCCC Awards staff needs to approve the project before you begin. Each project is required to submit the Silver Award Intent form for approval before starting the project. (Link Below)

#### Q: Does council need to approve the Silver Award project once the project is complete?

**A:** Yes, once the Silver Award project is complete, girls must submit the Silver Award Final Report to GSCCC Awards staff for review. The project will be approved only after it is confirmed to meet all the criteria set forth by GSUSA Silver Award requirements. (Link Below)

# Q: Can troops or girls request in-kind donations from local businesses or friends and family members?

**A:** Yes, in-kind donations may be sought. Girls should write a formal letter requesting donations from businesses. If they visit a business in person, they should wear their Girl Scout uniform. Girls should speak about their project when requesting donations.

## Q: How does a troop leader submit the project to receive the award for their troop?

**A:** The girls will submit the Silver Award Final Report to council. Once reviewed and approved the Congratulation cards and pins will be mailed to the address on the form. (Final Report link below).
