**February 18 – ACH #2:
50% of cookies picked up or
transferred as of 2/13/26**

That's right... Venmo, PayPal, and an improved, easier credit card scanning process are coming your way.




Payment Methods

Gold Award Spotlight

**Keiona
Nadig**

**Electric Composting for
Community
Sustainability**



Keiona Nadig (Troop 63006, Whispering Oaks) earned the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor in Girl Scouting, for her project Electric Composting for Community Sustainability. Recognizing that traditional composting can be inaccessible, Keiona introduced scalable, electric composting solutions to two high-waste community sites.

She installed electric composters at Monte Vista High School and the Simi Valley Samaritan Center, where hundreds of pounds of food waste are generated weekly. These units convert food waste into nutrient-rich compost within hours and operate using existing solar energy at each site. Keiona also led staff training sessions, created educational signage, and shared her work on social media to raise awareness. Her project diverts approximately 250 pounds of food waste per month, reducing landfill waste and methane emissions.

After graduation, Keiona plans to pursue environmental research, public policy, or sustainable engineering, continuing to combine science, advocacy, and practical solutions to drive meaningful community change.

Silver Award Spotlight Troop 15000

Congratulations to Silver Award Girl Scouts Philippa, Fiona, Olivia, and Ava from Troop 15000 (SU 150 – Surf City)!

For their Silver Award project, Here Comes the Signs, the team improved safety and the camper experience at Hidden Falls Girl Scout Camp by replacing outdated and missing signage.

After assessing needs with camp leaders, the girls researched designs, learned woodworking skills with a local partner, and built durable new directional signs and a weatherproof bulletin board. Their teamwork and leadership created a lasting improvement that helps campers and visitors navigate the camp more safely and confidently.



Bronze Award Spotlight

For their Bronze Award, Troop 55400 launched The Owl Project, an environmental stewardship initiative designed to protect local owl populations and promote natural rodent control. After learning about the harmful effects of rodenticides on wildlife, the girls researched owl habitats, designed and built nesting boxes, and installed them in safe, strategic locations using skills gained through their Junior Outdoor Journey. This thoughtful project supports healthier ecosystems, reduces reliance on pesticides, benefits local landowners, and empowers girls to take confident, meaningful action that creates lasting impact in their community.


