Objectives:

This patch was created to help girls learn the basics of sewing and how to use a sewing machine.

Instructions Page

Instructions for Mason Jar Pin Cushion sewing kit:

- Mason Jar
- Needles
- Thread
- Fabric (5 inch circle)
- Felt (2 inch circle)
- Small amount of stuffing

Instructions:

- Cut a 5 inch circle from your fabric.
- Make a running stitch all the way around the circle about 1/4 of an inch from the edge.
- Pull the thread gently to make the fabric go around the metal disc of the mason jar lid. Do not pull tightly yet.
- Stuff a small amount of stuffing between the metal disc lid and fabric. This is where you will put your sewing pins. Once the stuffing is in place pull the thread tightly and make a knot.
- Glue the felt circle to the inside of the jar lid.
- Place on a mason jar, if the fabric disc does not stay in the metal ring you can glue these together.
- Place all your sewing supplies in your jar.

Instructions for Scrunchies

Needed:

- Sewing Machine
- Fabric 18 in. By 3 1/2 in.
- Elastic (7 inches long)
- A needle and thread

Instructions:

- 1. Cut an 18 in. By 3 1/2 in. piece of fabric (your choice).
- 2. Fold in half with wrong side fabric out and sew along the long edge leaving the short edges open for elastic.
- 3. Turn fabric to right side of fabric on the outside. You will have a tube.
- 4. Thread elastic through the tube and stitch elastic ends together.
- 5. Sew the fabric together and you have made a scrunchie.

Instructions for Bean Bags

- 1. Cut a 3 in. by 3 in. piece of fabric (your choice)
- 2. Flip your bean bag inside out so the seam is inside your bag and sew three sides of the bean bag using your sewing machine or sew by hand.
- 3. Flip your bean bag right side out so your stitches are on the inside of the bean bag and fill your bean bag with pinto beans, rice, or other dried beans you have on hand.
- 4. Sew the side you didn't sew closed and play!!!!

Instructions for Finger Puppets

How to make a butterfly puppet Needed:

- 4 inch by 4 inch felt fabric.
- Butterfly pattern (below).
- Scissors.
- Needle and thread.
- Hot glue gun. (Optional)
- (optional) Extra fabric and/or sequins. beads, jewels for decoration

Instructions:

- 1. Use the butterfly pattern to cut out two pieces of felt.
- 2. Place the two pieces of felt on top of each other.
- 3. Starting at the upper wing using a blanket stitch or running stitch, start sewing the two pieces of felt together a quarter inch from the edge of the fabric along the upper wing down the bottom.
- 4. When you get to the bottom center of the butterfly start sewing straight up the middle the width of your finger to the top of the butterfly.
- 5. Repeat on the other wing.
- 6. (Optional) Cut out decorative shapes from felt and use a hot glue gun to glue them on your butterfly.
- 7. Now you have made a butterfly puppet!



Ideas:

Sample Girl Scout meeting for Daisy, Brownie, Junior: ***This sample is for a 2 hour meeting and can be done with hand sewing only***

-Start meeting with flag ceremony Girl Scout promise and Law

-Sewing supplies- Place these items on a tray Sewing needles Thread Scissors Thimble Needle threader Embroidery floss Pins Ruler

Show girls all items on the tray and explain the use for each one. Then cover the tray and take an item away. Show girls the tray again and have them guess which item is missing.

-Show the girls how to use a sewing machine (If you do not have a machine we have included a video of sewing machine basics)

-Make a mason jar sewing kit pin cushion (instructions included above)

-If girls cannot visit a local fabric store, you can watch the video of our local shop

-Make a needle book from felt have the girls practice hand stitching

They can sew on buttons, practice different hand stitches and design a cover they love.

-Make a felt cat toy

You can make any shape fill the inside with a small amount of stuffing and cat nip and then donate to your local shelter.
