The Fall Product Program gives troops and individually registered members the chance to earn startup funds for the new Girl Scout membership year by reaching out to friends and family, and asking for their support by purchasing nuts, chocolates, and magazines. All proceeds stay in California's Central Coast counties to benefit over 8,800 local Girl Scouts through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE).

The Girl Scout Leadership Experience is a collection of engaging, challenging, and fun activities that include earning badges, taking trips, exploring science, getting outdoors, and doing community service projects. The GSLE focuses on building skills in four key areas: STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), Outdoors, Life Skills, and Entrepreneurship. Girls can explore new interests and get out of their comfort zones in a safe, all-girl environment, and also have the opportunity to gain new skill sets that they may not be exposed to in the conventional classroom environment.

Through the Fall Product Program, Girl Scouts earn funds for their troop activities and community projects, while the council's proceeds support events, programs, volunteer training, camps, and facilities, plus the financial assistance that keeps Girl Scouting available and affordable for all. Through this program activity, girls develop five essential skills they will use throughout their lives: goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics.

The Fall Product Program is the perfect opportunity for troops to kick-off the Girl Scout year with a fun team-building activity that generates vital funds to support troop activities. Rather than waiting for the cookie sale in the winter, troops can earn startup money that they can use to



enjoy new and exciting opportunities right away. New troops with no resources in their treasury may use this program to fund needed uniforms and materials for a successful year.
