Celebrating Our Silver Award Girl Scouts: Making a Difference Across Six Counties

We are thrilled to celebrate the incredible achievements of our Silver Award Girl Scouts, who have completed a wide range of community projects across six counties as of July 2024. These committed young leaders have addressed local needs through projects that span the four pillars of the Girl Scouts program: STEM, Outdoors, Entrepreneurship, and Life Skills.

In the STEM category, **Troop 65304** created "Animal Shelter Volunteer Training Videos," enhancing volunteer efforts through technology to improve animal care. **Troop 61136** implemented "SENSE-Sational Projects," developing sensory-based activities that integrated STEM principles to support special needs education.

For Outdoors projects, **Troop 65500** contributed to environmental conservation with their "Monarch Butterfly Garden," supporting local ecosystems while educating the community about butterfly conservation. **Troop 65701** focused on restoring biodiversity with their "Restoring Mountain Meadows Plant Life" project, revitalizing mountain meadows and native plants. **Troop 60729** provided crucial resources to local pet shelters through their "Paws for Pets" project, while **Troop 50209** connected the community through animal-related activities with their "Connecting the Community with Animals at Stow House."

Several troops showcased their Entrepreneurship skills by addressing community needs creatively. **Troop 63043** completed multiple projects, including "The Dancers Closet," which provided dance apparel to underserved students, and "Lost and Found Makeover," which improved organizational spaces in local schools. **Troop 65701** also enriched local literacy programs by creating a "New Moorpark Library Girl Scout Book Section," providing a dedicated space for Girl Scout-related literature while **Troop 55101** taught essential childcare skills with their "Babysitting Workshop."

In the Life Skills pillar, **Troop 10208** organized a "Clothing Drive" to provide essential clothing to those in need, while **Troop 60729** ensured children had access to personal hygiene products through their "Toiletries for Tots (and more)" initiative. **Troop 63043** lifted community spirits with "Raising Hearts" and promoted sustainability through "One Plant at A Time." Troop 10000 fostered a love of reading with their project "A World of Stories: Sharing Reading with Kindergarteners." **Troop 66002** rallied volunteers to support local services with their "Helping Hands Event," while Troop 61085 revitalized youth sports facilities by providing new equipment through their "Boys and Girls Club Sports Equipment Refresh" project. Troop 50503 transformed a local venue into a community hub with their "Chapel Community Meeting Space" project, and Troop 63006 provided guidance to younger students through their "Middle School Transition" program. **Troop 41023** promoted literacy by establishing "The Magic of Books Lending Library," increasing access to literature. **Troop 50209** encouraged physical activity and sportsmanship with "Pitching for Kids." Our Bronze Award Girl Scouts have made a tremendous impact across various sectors, showcasing creativity and dedication to improving their communities.


