


Empowering Young Minds:

Mental Health Initiatives

Last year, we launched our Mental Health Toolkit initiative with the Affirmation Program Kit. This innovative resource helped over 5,600 Girl Scouts counteract negative thoughts and build self-confidence through positive affirmations. It was a powerful first step in teaching our girls that they can achieve their goals with the right mindset.

Building on our previous efforts, this year we've expanded our toolkit with the Early Bird Coping Skills Set. This new kit introduces essential coping skills that help manage stress and navigate challenging situations. Our partnership with Ventura County Behavioral Health enhances the quality and impact of these resources, equipping our Girl Scouts to thrive under pressure.



Recent studies, including one by Dr. Jennifer Hoffmann, highlight a unique vulnerability for girls during the pandemic, emphasizing that "girls' mental health requires more attention." As the U.S. Surgeon General describes the pandemic's impact on youth as "devastating," we are stepping up to meet this urgent need with dedicated resources and programs.

We're thrilled to share progress on the Monarch Breeding & Research Institute at Camp Arnaz, a collaborative effort between us, the Ventura County Resource Conservation District, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. This partnership underscores our commitment to educating girls on the significance of monarchs and pollinators while conserving and studying these remarkable creatures.

Recently, we achieved a significant milestone by planting over 186 pollinator and Monarch-friendly plants on

3.86 acres of land. This step forward highlights our dedication to creating a nurturing environment for these essential species.


