1. The Many Exciting Uses of Camp Songs:

- ♦ Occupy time in between activities.
- ♦ While walking to make it more fun.
- ♦ To entertain parents on the ride home.

2. Things To Remember When Singing or Teaching:

- ♦ If you know different words to a song, sing the version being taught. There is no "right" way, only different.
- When teaching, sing along with audience and add volume. This encourages them. The more loud and obnoxious a song is the better.
- ♦ Be enthusiastic!!!

3. How to Teach a Song:

- ♦ Sing the song all the way through.
- Sing the song line-by-line and have the audience repeat each line before moving on to the next. Remember to go slowly, so that the audience can learn.
- ♦ Sing the song together one more time.

4. Types of Songs:

- ♦ Repeat song-audience repeats every line. Great for just a quick overview.
- ♦ Reprise-same verse is repeated with variations, or the song is repeated with a line becoming silent.
- ♦ Action—song has a lot of actions that make it fun. It's more about the movement than the song.
- Orace-to show gratefulness for food before eating.
- ♦ Straight–a song with verses and chorus.
- Hybrid/Cross genre-uses two types in one, especially combination or repeat song with straight song-chorus is together, but verses are repeated.
- Short-a brief, funny song that is used to occupy a little time or used as a short transition between skits at a campfire.
- ♦ Fill-in-the-blank-repeat the same verse with variations each time.
- Morning-a song to wake you up in the morning. Gets those tired girls up and moving after spending halfthe-night giggling and talking.
- Soft-end of campfire, warm-fuzzy moment songs.
