• Equali-Tea 2020 Centennial Patch

This patch aligns with GSUSA's Democracy badges at every level. Tea had traditionally been a way for women to socialize and organize. Suffragettes used tea parties as a way to educate others and plan protest activities. These teas began to be called Equaliteas.
