Teen Mentoring Awards

Awards: Leader in Action, PA Pin, All-level Service to Girl Scouting Bar, CIT Pin, CIT II Pin

By earning these awards, you can deepen your understanding of what leadership development means and get excited about guiding others

Mentoring

As a Girl Scout mentor, you gain experience by sharing skills, testing knowledge, and trying out new leadership roles. The younger girls you mentor get a chance to be with and learn from you.

As you work directly with younger girls you serve as a champion who can help raise awareness of GS aim to deliver fun with purpose.

The more your skills develop from the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, the more you will want to encourage younger girls to think of themselves as leaders as well.

Leadership vs Community Service

Leadership Hours: plan and direct your own activity

Community Service: participate and help lead activities that have been planned for you



Leadership in Action Award

Girl Scout Cadette LIA (Leadership in Action) Award Patch. This award is for mentoring Girl Scout Brownies through the any of the three leadership journeys.

Requirements: Must complete 6th grade

Program Aide Pin

Cadettes receive their Program Aide award by earning one LiA award, completing council-designed leadership course training, and working directly with younger girls (over six sessions in addition to the one done for the LiA).

Requirements: Must complete council PA training, and 6th grade





Service to Girl Scouting Bar Cadette, Senior, Ambassador

The Service to Girl Scouting Bar is earned by volunteering at least 20 hours to the Girl Scout organization, at the troop, SU, Association or council level.

A girl can volunteer at a special event for younger girls, be an office assistant for their council or service unit or help with special projects. Girls track their own hours, and the leader approves and awards the pin.

Requirements: Cadette must complete 6th grade
Senior must complete 8th grade
Ambassador must complete 10th grade

Counselor in Training Pin (I and II)

CIT Pin: Seniors and Ambassadors mentor young girls in a camp setting as they build skills toward becoming a camp counselor. To earn this award, Girl Scouts complete a leadership course designed by the council on outdoor experiences and work with younger girls over the course of a camp session.

CIT II Pin: Ambassadors earn this award by working with younger girls over the course of at least one camp session while focused on increasing their skills in one specific area--such as riding instruction, lifeguarding, or the arts.

Requirements: must receive CIT Pin first
